


Now Sowing blog posts are written by the Seed Library Team, and they generate a lot of traffic toward seeds.



What does all that look like in our ILS?






We created an I-Type in Sierra so seeds could circulate differently from other items.

This is also where we specify the origin of the seeds.

Each individual barcoded packet of seeds gets an ID number for tracking purposes.

Format for seeds is 3-D Objects.

Extra titles for varieties and scientific names.



These 856 fields let us add images and links to the seed records in our catalog.














A few more details about Pima County's Seed Library

- Seeds officially check out for 6 months, but we do a monthly purge of seeds from patron accounts
- 10 seed packs per card, per month checkout limit
- Reserve up to 10 seed packs at a time
- Staff suppress and unsuppress seed records in the catalog as needed







Pros and Cons



- Pros
 - Searchability for patrons
 - Ability to put the seeds on hold
 - Stats

- Cons
 - Labour intensive to start
 - How to check in an item that's not coming back


- Looking to the future

 - Updating images
 - Potential for additional search terms (soil types, sun exposure, etc.)
 - Linking seeds that work well together




Hillsboro Public Library – Library of Things



- The Hillsboro Library of Things was established in 2014, with the rest of our county cooperative starting their Thing collections in 2018.
- Our cooperative uses the Polaris ILS, and we started using BiblioCommons in 2018.
- Currently our system has 930 bibliographic records for Things (2,504 item records) and 1,229 bibliographic records for board games (2,539 item records).






BiblioCommons Advantages




- Before BiblioCommons, we linked from our webpage to the catalog using a title search for alternative titles that we added to the 246 fields in our bib records.
- We can now create more sophisticated links on our webpage that don't need the alternative titles, and we can limit by branch location.
- Most of our Things and board games now have images in the catalog.




Adding Images to Our Bibliogrpahic Records



- After being warned off using inline linking in our records, each library started hosting their own images. Hillsboro created a free Flickr account for our images.
- Last year, Flickr limited free accounts to 100 images, so we upgraded to a Pro account to get unlimited storage and to keep our photos private.
- We get a static URL from Flickr, and add it to an 856 field in the bib record.
